Why & How

EazyCity is specialised in providing study and work programs abroad and cultural exchange experiences. We work directly with Top Irish Secondary Schools in the South-East of Ireland, specifically in Co. Waterford and Co. Cork to offer year-round and term academic placements.

EazyCity offers both options of public and private schools, as well as boarding schools at times. All our academic programmes include full-board accommodation in carefully selected and Garda vetted host families.

Stages of the Irish Secondary school system

The standard Irish Education System is divided into six years. The first stage is a three-year programme culminating with the newly revamped Junior Certificate Examination.

This is followed by Transition Year, equivalent to 4th Year secondary, or grade 10 in US system. The Transition Year Programme (TYP) is a very popular choice at EazyCity amongst all our international students, who wish to spend an academic year in Ireland.

The main purpose of the TY programme and content is aimed at providing learners with enriching personal and professional development opportunities, while also following the traditional academic subjects, as preparation for the Leaving Cert.



Years 1 to 3 | Junior Certificate Cycle

Average ages of 11 years to 14 years. The Junior Certificate would equate with Junior High in the USA or just under the GCSE Levels in the UK. The State Examinations Commission (SEC) marks the end of this cycle in 3rd year and is known as the Junior Certificate of the Department of Education & Skills. More and more, today, the curriculum introduces learners to modern languages, including French, Spanish and German; the Sciences, including Physics, Chemistry, Biology; Business Studies, Domestic Science, Art, Music, Technology, Woodwork, ICT, amongst other many subjects and modules that most international learners would not do in their own country.

Junior Certificate students must take Irish, English, Maths, History and Geography along with a European language. International Students are of course exempt from Irish.



Year 4 | Transition Year Cycle

Average age of 15 to 16 years. This year is perhaps the most popular year and program amongst our EazyCity international students. In most Irish schools, this is an optional year, which many students decide to do! Transition Year (TY) provides a strong basis for 5th & 6th years, but at the same time allows learners to explore many other subject areas, and take part in outside projects and cultural experiences.

This helps learners mature and to select subjects carefully. Most schools in Ireland allow students to participate in work experience for 1-4 weeks during Transition Year.

Junior Certificate students must take Irish, English, Maths, History and Geography along with a European language. International Students are of course exempt from Irish.





Year 5 to 6 | Leaving Certificate Cycle

Average age of 16, 17 and 18 years. The curriculum of the Leaving Certificate follows directly from the Junior Certificate, but some subject subjects are discarded as the learner begins to specialise. The Leaving Certificate standard is equivalent to the UK A-level examination, or the International Baccalaureate or Advanced Placement in the USA.

Depending on the standard attained in the chosen Leaving Certificate subjects, a points total is earned. This total is compared with the entry threshold of the University, Technical Colleges and other third level institutions, and places allocated accordingly. For example, what in Spain would be called "EBAU".

It is also widely accepted as an entrance qualification for universities throughout the European Union and around the world.











Guidance

It is important to note that each secondary school in Ireland has a Career Guidance Department that assists our learners with applications to their chosen universities. These career guidance departments work closely with all students to identify potential course options and career choices that will be most suitable to their interests and/or profesional goals.



At EazyCity we also assist all our international students during this challenging process and works closely with the career guidance departments to make sure our students receive the help and support they need, each step of the way.

Make it official

All our international students take advantage during their year in Ireland to join one of our Academic English and Exam Preparation courses, giving them the opportunity to sit an official Cambridge English or Trinity College official examination.



Ireland has some of the finest and most reputable Universities and Colleges in Europe, and perhaps in the world! Including Trinity College Dublin (TCD), University College Dublin (UCD), Dublin City University (DCU), National University of Ireland Maynooth (NUIM), University College Cork (UCC), University of Limerick (UL), National University of Ireland Galway (NUIG), and now the South-East Technical University (SETU).

Recognition & Validation

At EazyCity we also prepare all the homologation documents that each international student will require upon return to their home country

All our exam preparation courses are delivered at our flagship schools in Waterford or Cork City and/or online. Our schools are official preparation centres and registered exam centres for both Cambridge English and Trinity College London.

Princing & Conditions

Price Program Includes:

- Airport Transfer on arrival on 2 agreed dates.
- Host Family allowance, all host families are police checked (Garda Vetted).
- School Registration includes lockers and insurance.
- EazyCity Coordinator fee. 24/7 Support in person and on the phone for the student.
- Airport Transfer on Departure on 2 agreed dates.
 Extra accommodation: (Students who stay longer than their due departure from the programme will incur an extra cost of €35 a night).

Please Note: the price does not include any personal expenses, and it does not include any flights or travel expenses should the student wish to go home for a visit at any stage during the academic year programme with EazyCity.

These expenses will be sent to the student / organisation and payments can be made online through our EazyCity system.

Important - Validation and recognition: EazyCity will provide all necessary documentation required for your validation and recognition process in your home country. <u>We are NOT able to offer further support outside of Ireland.</u>

Other Arrivals: Any arrival and departures incurred outside the agreed dates will be at the cost of the organisation/student. This cost can be taken from the refund of an early returnee. Also, some locations especially the city schools require bus/ train short journeys. This is payable by the student as and when they require it. EazyCity may be able to help students by providing a leap card, which can be paid at reception or online.

Key Dates - Academic Calendar 2024/2025

- Arrivals and start of program: September 26th to 28th September 2024.
- St. Paul's Waterford: presentation at 11am on 28th August.
- October Mid-Term Break: Monday 28th October 1st November 2024.
- Christmas Break: All schools will close on Friday 20th December 2024, which will be the final day of the school term. All schools will re-open on Monday 6th January 2025.
- February Mid-Term Break: Post-primary schools will close from Monday 17th February 2025 to Friday 21st February 2025
- Easter Break: All schools close on Friday, 11 April 2025, which is the final day of the school term, unless changes are needed to make up for time lost due to unforeseen school closures. If a school needs to make up such time, it can shorten the Easter break by staying open, up to and including Wednesday, 16 April 2025. All schools re-open on Monday, 28 April 2025.
- Departures and End of Program/School Year: May 31st 2025.
